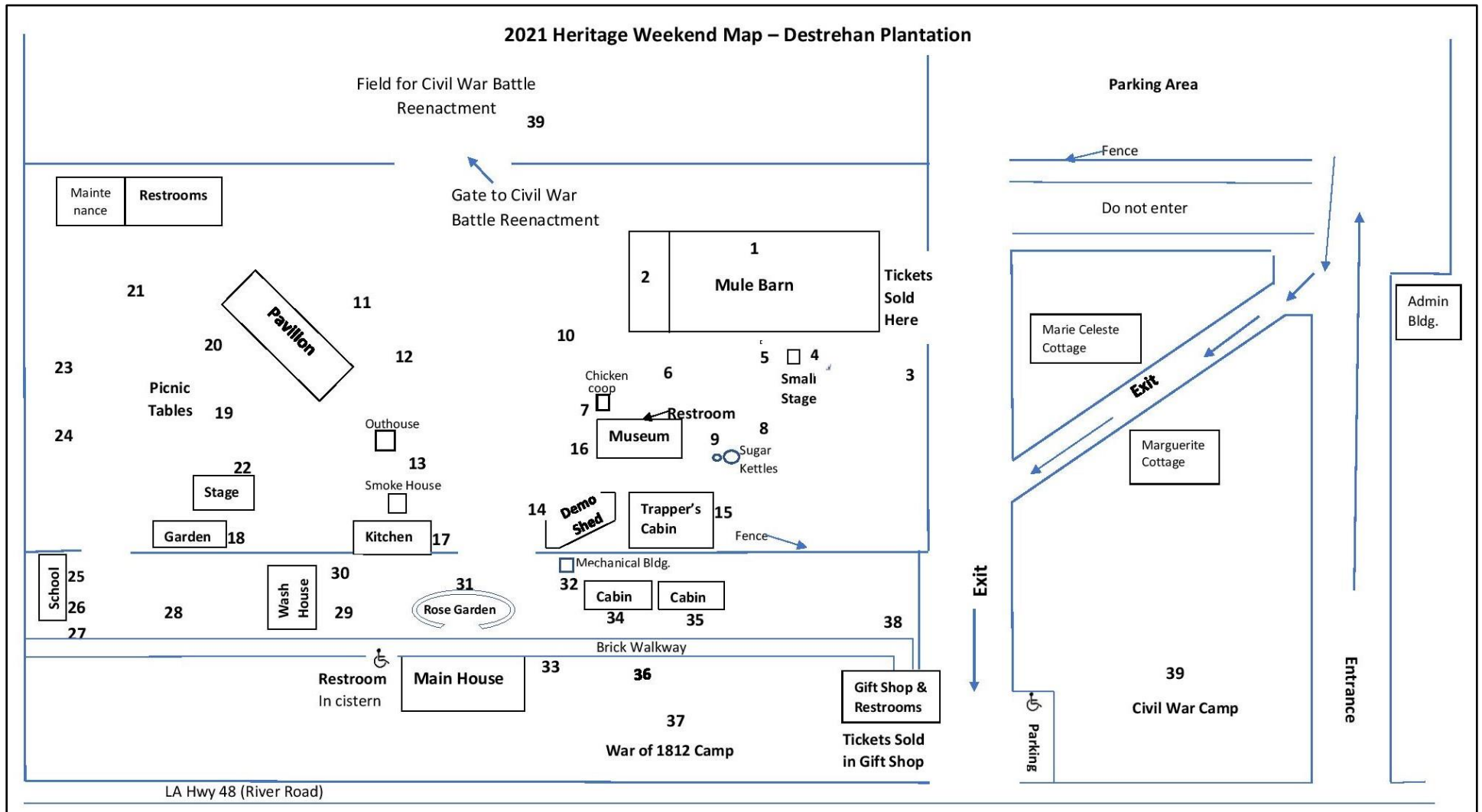


Thanks for visiting Destrehan Plantation during Heritage Weekend (May 1-2, 2021 from 9:00 a.m.-3:00 p.m. each day).
